Since Natural England (NE) facilitated a meeting of interested parties down at Lydd, Phil Tapp (the DAA founder) and myself attended. NE had a plan to employ a 'beach cleaner' to help manage the ever growing problem of rubbish on the 'point' and the wider 'Nature Reserve'...a lot of the rubbish came from the angling fraternity! Funding was the main issue and NE was looking for voluntary contributions to get the scheme going. We agreed to help out as did a lot of other local concerns.

That was about eight years ago, Chris Shore the beach cleaner does a great job under the direction of Owen Leyshon who heads up the Romney Marsh Countryside Project and is our 'Shingle Officer'. Owen who manages the use of the estate, we have lots of 'film crews', photographers, fashion shoots etc. Owen also organises rubbish collections as well as running regular voluntary beach cleans which the association supports. The DAA agreed at the AGM to increase its quarterly payments to £500 to give the Romney Marsh Countryside Project our ongoing support.

Over the years we have tried to educate our members, I believe with great success in the importance of not leaving any 'rubbish' behind or interfering with the boats or their equipment. We all want to protect Dungeness, today and for the future. Tony Hills

Budget for two 'Dredges' per year

A concern raised over the years is the amount of snags around the point caused primarily by the loss of tackle when it gets busy. Over the last couple of years we have with the help of fishermen 'dragged' the point to break up and remove old tackle from the seabed. This has been organised and managed by our new vice chairman Simon Newman. This process has had

mixed results but the committee consider it is important to keep an 'eye' on the beach and be prepared. So it was agreed at the AGM that we would budget this year for two 'dredges' to allow us as a committee to act if the reports indicate that we have a problem with lost leads and line.
